CANTON Larry McAllister and his brothers have partnered with Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio to rehabilitate the house they grew up in — so that a new family will have the opportunity to call it home.

The McAllisters generously provided the funds needed to preserve their childhood home, located at 200 Schwalm Ave. NE in Canton. They also volunteered alongside the future homeowner, sharing stories about their favorite memories from growing up. Now that the home is complete, it will be purchased by Reanna Finnell, a single mother who is raising two young daughters.

At 4 p.m. Friday, May 27 at the home, the McAllister family will pass off the keys to their childhood home to the Finnell family in a special house dedication ceremony. Both the McAllister and Finnell families will speak about what the home means to them, and Reanna will exchange her first zero-interest mortgage payment for the keys to her new home. **Members of the media are invited to attend.**
