Canton, Ohio, November 29, 2023 — Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio, in partnership with Massillon City Schools and the junior and senior Construction Trades students at Massillon Washington High School, proudly announces the completion of their third joint construction project. This latest partnership build, a new home at 243 26th Street NW, Massillon, is a shining example of community collaboration and educational empowerment. The public is invited to the home dedication on December 13 from noon to 1pm at the new home.

This project marks a significant milestone for the Gowins family, who will celebrate their first Christmas in the warmth and safety of their new home. In partnership with Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio and working alongside Massillon students, the family has played an integral role in building their future home and will purchase it with an affordable 0% interest mortgage.

Beth Lechner, CEO of Habitat for Humanity East Central Ohio, shared her enthusiasm about the project: "Investing in the future of the construction trades is pivotal for our community. By partnering with Massillon City Schools, we're not just building homes; we're nurturing the next generation of skilled tradespeople. This initiative is an investment in our collective future, ensuring the vital skill of building homes is valued and passed on."
